Lives you have touched.

You are helping to make the Washington County Senior Citizen Center a safer place.

Because of you, the Senior Citizen Center now has an AED in case of an emergency. You are helping to save a life.

Thanks to generous donors like you, the Washington County Community Foundation was able to award a grant to the Senior Citizen center to purchase an AED. “We are so thankful to get the grant for the AED from the Foundation. I can rest easier knowing we have this available to serve our senior community,” stated Center Director, Gail Napier. “Thank you so much.”

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. AEDs are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest (SCA).

SCA is a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. When this happens, blood stops flowing to the brain and

other vital organs.

SCA usually causes death if it is not treated within minutes. In fact, each minute of SCA leads to a 10 percent reduction in survival. Using an AED on a person who is having SCA may save the person’s life.

Federal Tax Benefit: $\$5,000.00 \times .395 = \$1,975.00$

State Tax Benefit: $\$5,000.00 \times .2 = \$1,000$
Every Hoosier household is limited to \$1,000 tax credit per year.

Total Tax Benefit: \$2,975.00

It will cost this donor \$2,025 to make a \$5,000 gift!

Donors must itemize to receive the federal tax deduction and have to pay over \$1,000 in Indiana State taxes in order to fully experience both of these benefits.
